Public appearance is what people see.

Operational reality is what systems execute.

The two are not always identical.

Institutional literacy requires understanding both.

MODULE 5

Position Before Action

Systems respond differently depending upon position.

Position influences interpretation.

Interpretation influences procedure.

Procedure influences outcome.

MODULE 6

Institutional Logic

Institutions follow internal logic.

That logic may not always be visible from the outside.

Understanding institutional logic allows outcomes to be viewed as the product of structure rather than mystery.
